LIFE GUARD TRAINING:

This is an American Red Cross course taught primarily on-site at Pathfinder Lodge. There will be some indoor pool content as well. Training is video, lecture, hands-on and water-based. The successful candidate will receive certifications in Red Cross Lifeguarding with Waterfront, First Aid, and CPR for the professional rescuer. Successful completion of the Red Cross swimming test is required as the first section of this Lifeguard Training. Written and practical evaluations are given at the end of the course. Meals and lodging are included.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING:

This is an intensive training for teenagers to learn how to be leaders in today's world and, more importantly, in today's church. Participants will learn specific leadership skills for the camp community as well. This training is designed to provide leadership skills that are useful outside the camp setting, using camp activities as an experiential learning environment. After completing the training week, the attendees may be asked to be a Leaderin-Training during a week of camp,

when they will be able to practice the newly learned skills, benefitting from further hands-on experience under the close supervision of proven leaders. They will also have opportunities to be with a variety of leaders to see how different leadership styles work in various activities.

X-TREME OUTDOORS:

Learn survival skills; experience tent camping and cooking outdoors, while completing daily challenges as a group. This session develops a self-sufficient group, ready for the wilderness by the end of the week.

TEEN CHALLENGE WEEK:

This adventure includes team building, individual challenge activities, snorkeling, sailing, canoeing, a ropes course, as well as challenges to build faith.

PATHFINDER LODGE

Reasonable swimming skills are necessary.

WORSHIP PERFORMANCE

WIIK: Learn how to put together a worship experience using several performing and visual arts. Campers will work on a worship experience for the closing program at the end of the week. Area churches will be invited to join us as the campers lead in a time of music, performance, and other visual arts to bring all closer to God during worship.

LIFE-SIZED GAMES: During the week you will play your favorite games-but LIFE-SIZED! Imagine your favorite board games, table sports, and indoor hobbies in a way you can only experience at camp-HUGE! Challenge other campers or try to beat the staff, exploring all the fun and wacky ways to play.

WATER ADVENTURE:

Experience a week of aquatic adventure, including snorkeling, water skiing, tubing, canoeing, kayaking, sailing, water polo, and more. Every day is a different adventure in, on, and around the water. ADIRONDACKS CANOE

TRIP: This is a seven-day trip through one of five wilderness areas of the Adirondack Mountains' rivers and lakes. The trip will place campers in out-back areas away from civilization. Everyone pitches in to cook, clean up, and learn how to camp with a leave-no-trace mind set. Campers need to be able to paddle and carry a canoe with a partner. We will be camping out in tents and spending our days paddling in lakes and rivers. Reasonable swimming skills are necessary. The trip is led by John Buskey and Alison Liedkie. Alison is an alumna of previous Adirondack trips. She has been a rafting guide and is trained in wilderness skills. Tents, canoes, life jackets and paddles area provided. Participants need a sleeping bag and a backpack suitable for a week of camping. Contact VPCC if this is an issue. Four registrations before June 1st are required in order to schedule our expert leader. The trip is limited to 9 participants to meet Adirondack Park restrictions.
